It gives us great pleasure to introduce Russell Maliphant Dance Company's first ever Annual Report.

These unprecedented times have created extraordinary challenges for the performing arts and we are proud that we have emerged from it stronger, as you will see from the variety and scope of the content in this report. Our success is down to a number of things: luck, with the timing of our *maliphantworks3* production just before the pandemic began; good management by our wonderful team; and our generous supporters, including the Cultural Recovery Fund.

Although restrictions resulted in us having to postpone national and international tours of new and old productions and the rehearsal periods associated with them, we have used the time forced upon us to think creatively about who we are and what we want to achieve, pivoting the company away from performances to research programmes, teaching, and increasing our digital presence, whilst unable to perform.

We are working again with some of the dancers from *Silent Lines*, plus we will bring in some new dancers whom we are currently recruiting. The new show will tour from Autumn 2022 and we look forward to seeing some of you there.

Thank you so much for your continuing support for our work. We look forward enormously to seeing you again soon and welcoming you back to the theatre.

#### WHAT WE CREATED

One of the artistic aims of RMDC is the exploration of the relationship between movement, light and sound. We have continued to explore this framework throughout the past year:

#### **Silent Lines**

Silent Lines draws upon Maliphant's research and explorations in dance and anatomy using a unique mix of movement, animated video projection, and lighting. Silent Lines premiered at DanceEast in April 2019 and toured across the UK throughout the rest of the year to great critical acclaim.

In 2020, *Silent Lines* was due to perform at several international venues in the USA, Germany, France and the UK, but due to COVID restrictions we have had to reschedule the tour to 2023.

#### New production

The company's next and newest production is currently in its research and development stage.

It will explore a mix of movement and visually rich language inspired by the abstract expressionist paintings of the American artist Jackson Pollock.

With our performers, light will shape the space and construct environments of mood and contrast through which meanings are engendered, allowing for points of contact, divergence, collision and absorption.

This new production will tour throughout the UK from Autumn 2022.

#### maliphantworks3

In February 2020, just before COVID restrictions began, RMDC presented *maliphantworks3* at The Coronet Theatre for 13 nights. The evening included a world premier of *The Space Between*, a duet performed by Dana Fouras and Russell Maliphant; two specially commissioned films; and a revival of 2018's highlight *Duet*.

# **HOW WE ENGAGED**

#### 144 educational workshops delivered

RMDC's planned programme this year spanned working with schools and dancers in training, and involved collaborations with partners to deliver projects and mentoring.

In response to the national lockdown, we adapted our planned programmes to take place online. This enabled us to widen our reach, work with larger groups and deliver internationally and intergenerationally with dancers aged 18 to 85.

# Online Company Classes 1988 company class attendees

Classes are focused on Maliphant's core principles, exploring individual movement potential. This includes increasing body awareness, articulation and strength whilst exploring choices in movement and dynamics within a playful practice. Drawing on anatomical information as a resource for movement and improvisation, classes encourage connection, balance and listening to the body in movement.

#### Educating teachers and students

In 2020 RMDC commissioned a beautiful educational tool for teachers to engage students and dancers in training, based on *Silent Lines*. Further to this success the company is now developing a digital education pack based on *Two*. Due to be ready for the academic Autumn term 2021, the pack is being designed to reach GCSE, A level and vocational courses and the company hopes to become part of the AQA Dance specification.

#### Mentoring

The company's mentoring programme aims to increase knowledge exchange and skills development within the organisation as well as externally, through mentoring a range of upcoming professionals in the sector. In turn, we will feed back our learning from these activities into our internal discussions and development.

In addition, the company is implementing a new process called 'reverse mentoring' for the board – a programme that enables our apprenticeship colleagues and young dancers to advise and guide the board to facilitate a different understanding.

#### Student Placements

For the first time post-restrictions we hosted a diverse group of 30 dancers in training over 3 days for an extensive student placement programme. In addition to taking class with company dancer Grace Jabbari, students attended an outreach workshop, met the company staff to discuss alternative roles in the industry, and observed Maliphant rehearsing for the staging of *maliphantworks3* at The Coronet Theatre, London.


# **WORKING WITH OTHERS**

#### National Youth Dance Company collaboration

Maliphant was invited to be Guest Director of National Youth Dance Company (NYDC) in 2019/20 which was extended due to the pandemic. Working with the company of 39 dancers over four residencies, Maliphant and his Company dancers created, developed and rehearsed a new commission.

#### RMDC and EncoreEast

RMDC has consistently explored and championed movement potential with bodies of all ages and has been mentoring company dancers Alethia Antonia and Edd Arnold as they create a new piece with EncoreEast – a company of dancers aged 50 to 80. As well as developing the participants' movement practice, this also enables the Company and participants to further examine Maliphant's process and practice.

# **English National Ballet**

Working again with collaborators Dana Fouras, Panagiotis Tomaras and Stevie Stewart, Maliphant was commissioned by ENB to create a piece entitled *Echoes*. The pandemic led to a delay in the live performance, so the first release of this production was as a film directed by Michael Nunn & William Trevitt in November 2020.

Echoes was one of five world premieres performed live at a special event at Sadler's Wells which was eventually performed live for a full week in May 2021.

### **LEARNING**

RMDC has committed to investing further in its research around the exploration of human movement and the relationships between dance, health and aesthetics in performance. The research aims to explore Maliphant's dance and bodywork practice and the influence that it has on dancers' performance potential, career longevity and healthful participation in dance, no matter the context or age. The project is collaborating with researchers who share the company's curiosity and together we hope to contribute new knowledge to the dance sector, as well as the academic and applied fields of dance and dance science.

### Maliphant gains his PhD

The company is delighted to announce that Maliphant has gained his PhD from Canterbury Christ Church University. He is the first choreographer ever to gain a PhD by publication as choreography, and it is this research and constant exploration which is stimulating the company's research programme.



#### DIGITAL

#### **Digital Archive**

In response to COVID, the company created a Digital Archive of full performance recordings and short clips from creative productions to enable audiences to access the company's repertoire anywhere, any time, in any place. This treasure trove of material provides insight into the artistic processes of the company and its collaborators.

To date, RMDC's archives have been viewed online 25,522 times



#### Live streams

In addition to archived video footage, during lockdowns the Company offered free live streams of recent works, enabling audience members to experience the work from home, and engage in Q&A sessions with Maliphant and his collaborator Dana Fouras. These proved extremely popular with an overall live viewing figure of 90,000
